## Why I Wish to Serve the Sea Pines Community:

- CSA has been remiss in failing to address traffic at Sea Pines Circle including pursuing (at Town expense) any of three solutions proposed in 2016 Circle to Circle Report
- CSA not involved in developing Island's 2020-2040 Comprehensive Plan, six lane bridge, no tolls, increasing tourism, etc.
